

## Countable and Uncountable 1

A countable noun can be singular or plural. An uncountable noun has only one form. We cannot use numbers with uncountable nouns. On the other hand, we can use numbers with countable nouns. Examples of nouns usually countable: song, beach, bill, accident, battery, cup.

*Rice is an uncountable noun. So we cannot say 'one rice', 'two rice', etc. Examples of nouns usually uncountable music, sand, money, luck, electricity, water.*

You can use uncountable nouns alone (without the/my/some, etc.).

Jessica was listening to classical music.

There's no heating in the basement.

He has lots of work to do.
