

## Present Perfect Continuous

We use the present perfect continuous for an activity that has recently stopped or just stopped.

Pronoun	Auxiliary	Be	Main Verb
	<i>Have</i>	<i>Been (not)</i>	<i>Verb -ing</i>
I	have	've been (have been)	driving
He/she/it	has	's been (has been)	working
We/you/they	have	've been (have been)	doing

Ryan has been walking around campus all day.

Albert has been looking for a job since 2011.

*You can use the present perfect continuous for actions repeated over a period of time.*
