

## Will be doing / will have done

We use **will have done** to say that something will already be complete before a time in the future.

Pronoun	will	To be	Main Verb
	<i>Future</i>	<i>Positive or Negative</i>	<i>Verb -ing</i>
I	Will	(not) be	going
He/she/it	Will	(not) be	calling
We/you/they	Will	(not) be	writing

After getting enough students, Francis will be talking to the international program director for a promotion.
