

Have to and must

It is necessary to do it, I am obliged to do it. Have to is more common than must. In negative sentences, we use don't, doesn't, didn't.

Es necesario u obligatorio hacer algo. *Have* es más usado que *must*.

You can say: I'll have to / I won't have to...

I'm going to have to...

I might / may have to...

Anthony doesn't have to wake up at 5AM on Saturdays.
